B. NCORE (Discussion – 10 minutes)

NCORE (National Conference on Race and Ethnicity) remains a popular conference. Committee agreed to wait before approving the NCORE PARs received. Last year, the college selected four applicants for NCORE funding through staff development. This year’s conference will take place in May. During the next meeting, the committee will decide whether to establish an application process for NCORE funding.

C. Dissemination Plans (Discussion – 10 minutes)

It was noted that there have been different iterations of dissemination plans requirements throughout the year.
